

Census Bureau Reports That Single Parent Households Have Exceptionally High Hardship Rates

The Census Bureau recently reported that 42% of single parent households experienced at least one of nine measured hardships in 2011, compared to 22% for the population as a whole. U.S. Census Bureau, *Extended Measures of Well-Being: Living Conditions in the United States:* 2011 (Sept. 2013), available at http://www.census.gov/prod/2013pubs/p70-136.pdf. Multiple hardships were experienced by 26% of single parent households, compared to 12% for the population as a whole.

The table below reports the percent of single parent households and of all households experiencing each of the nine measured hardships. The figures are taken from Census Bureau Table 8 available for download at http://www.census.gov/hhes/well-being/publications/extended-11.html.
