In his roles as practicing lawyer, policy advocate, and team co-owner, Chris Kelly has been a consistent and progressive voice for social justice and advancement for all.

Leaving his role as a senior executive at Facebook (after serving as the first General Counsel, Chief Privacy Officer, and Head of Global Public Policy) to run for Attorney General of California in 2010, Chris stressed the need to have innovative policy makers from the private sector actively engaged in government reform efforts.

In 2012, Chris led a coalition to revitalize and modernize California's anti-human trafficking laws. As co-author of Proposition 35, by number of votes and margin of victory the most successful initiative in the history of the state, he drove major reforms that have redirected law enforcement resources toward the worst offenders and empowered county prosecutors to focus on trafficking cases.

As co-owner of the Sacramento Kings since 2013, after helping build a coalition of partners to keep the team in Sacramento, he has worked with his partners and figures throughout the NBA to encourage voting through the Kings' Rally the Vote initiative and bolstered the team and league's efforts to engage actively on policing reform.

Chris's investments in technology, media, and finance businesses continue to innovate and democratize markets and provide for a more inclusive economy for all. Recently, his focus on investments supporting blockchain-based businesses have helped drive and expand this most innovative sector of our economy.
